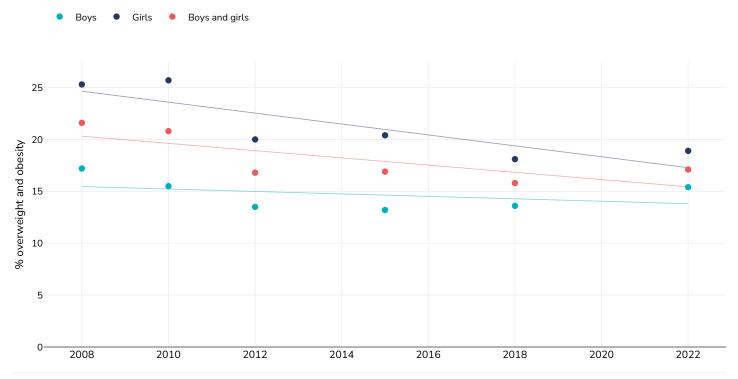

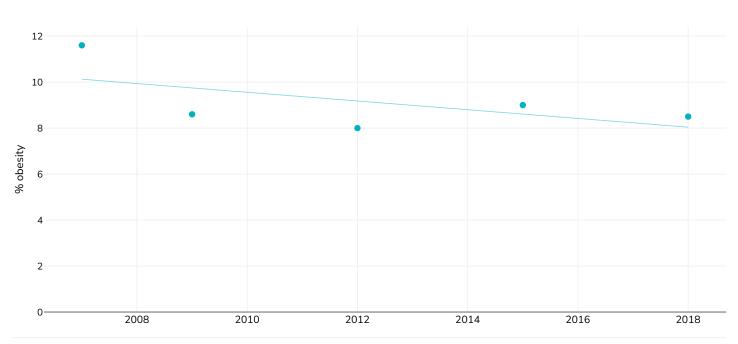

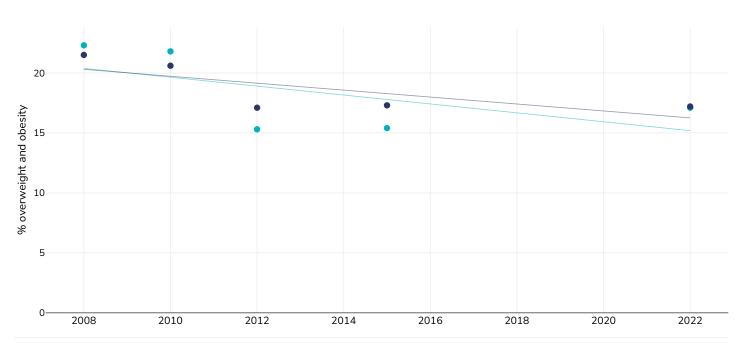

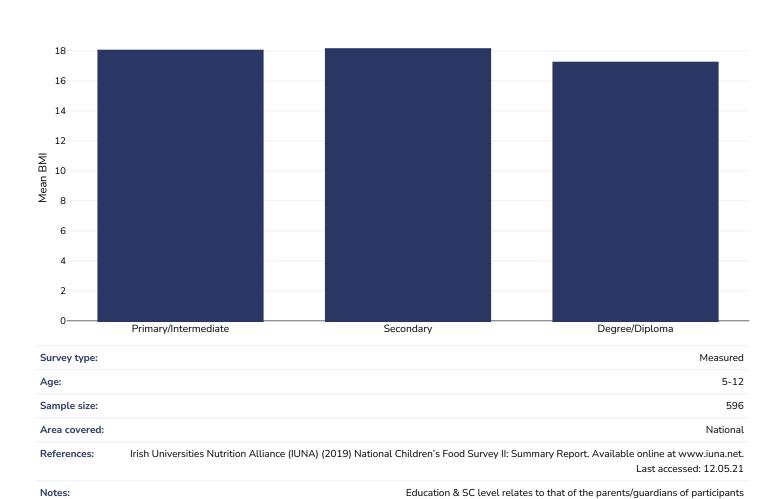

Mean BMI

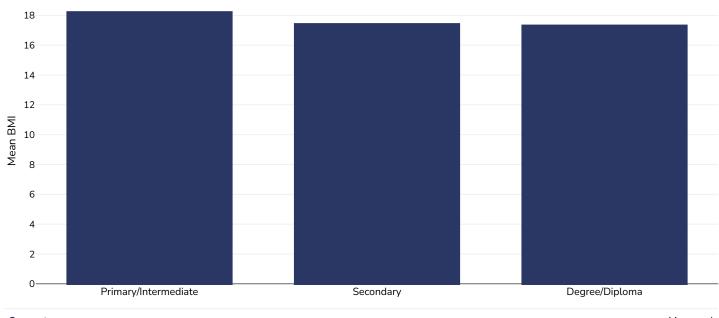

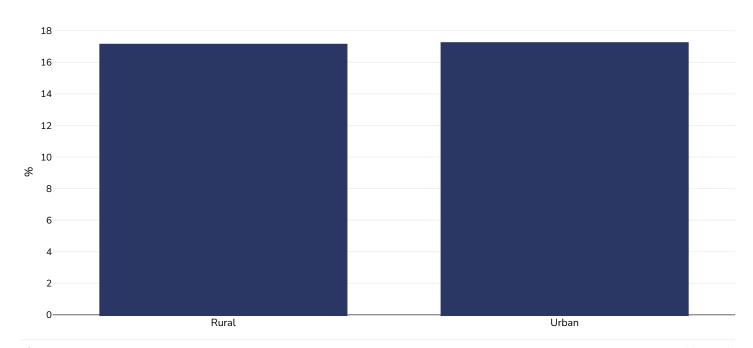

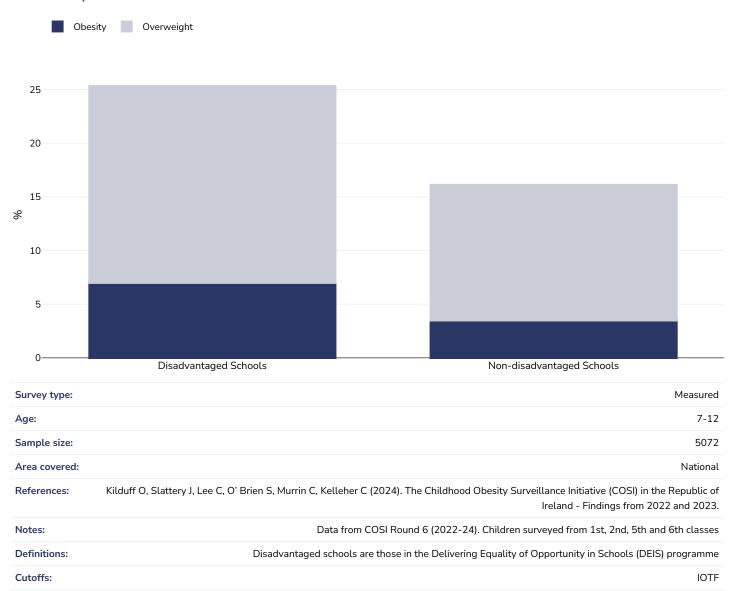

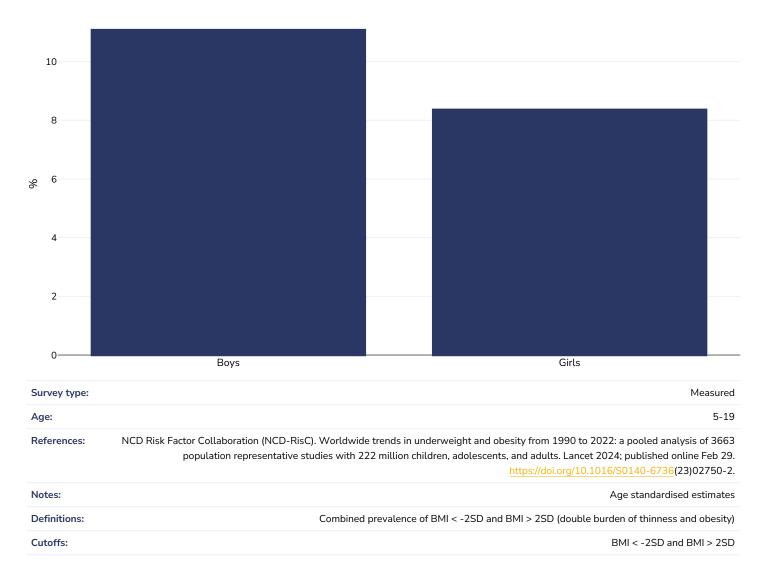

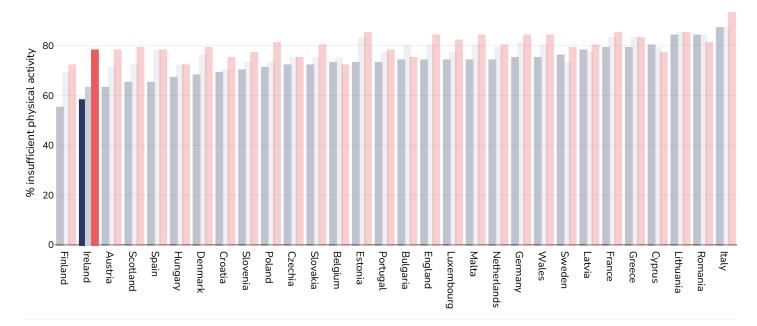

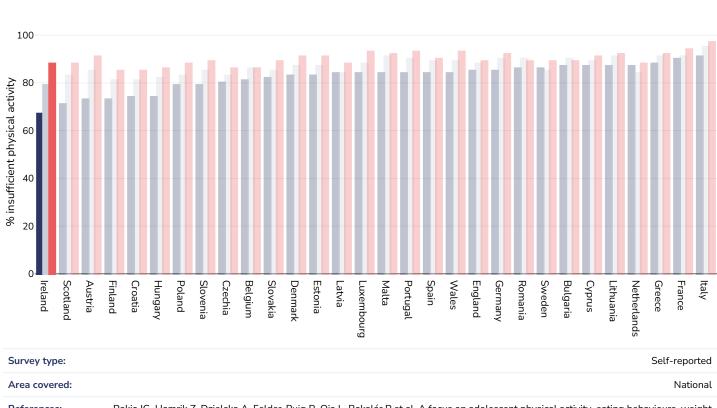

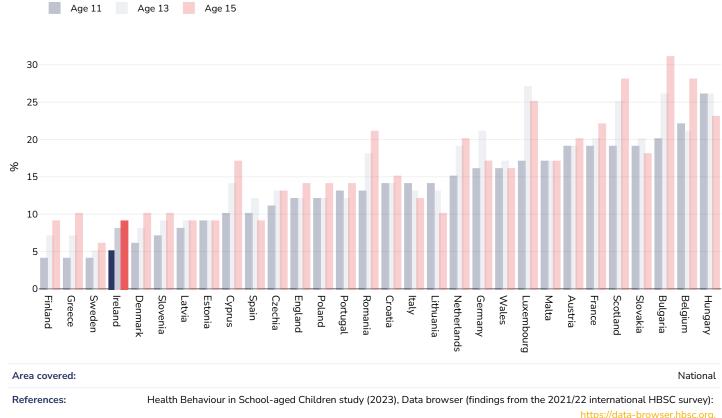

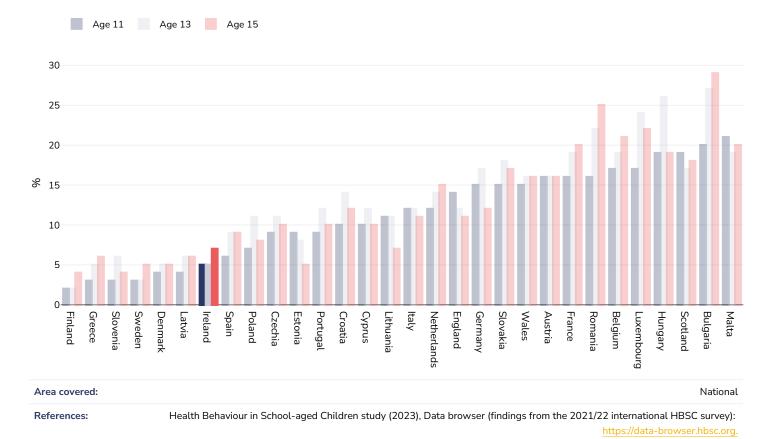
Proportion who reported drinking sugary soft drinks daily (at least once)

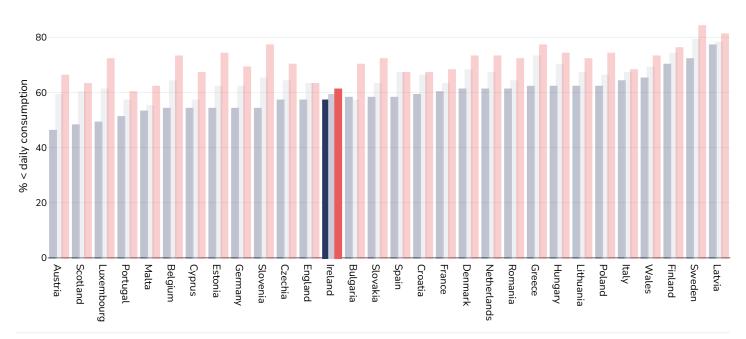

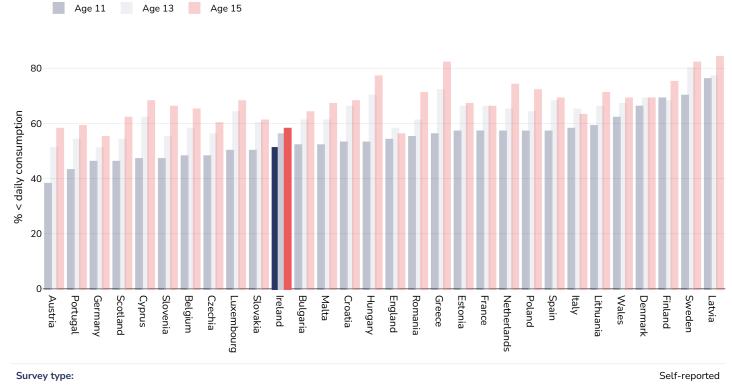

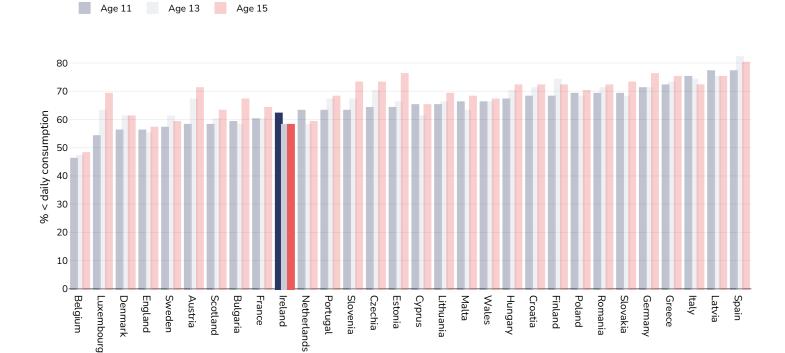

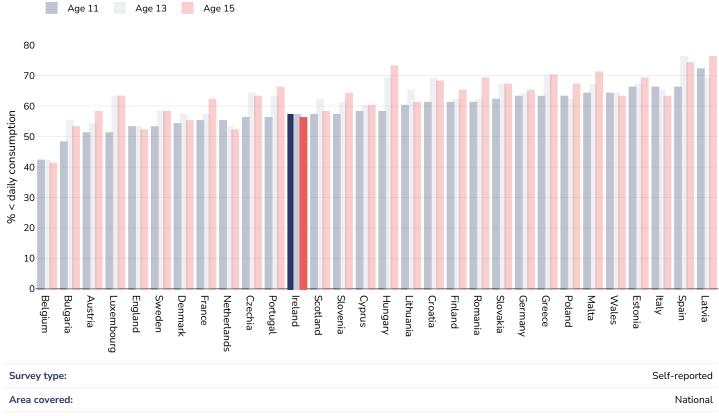

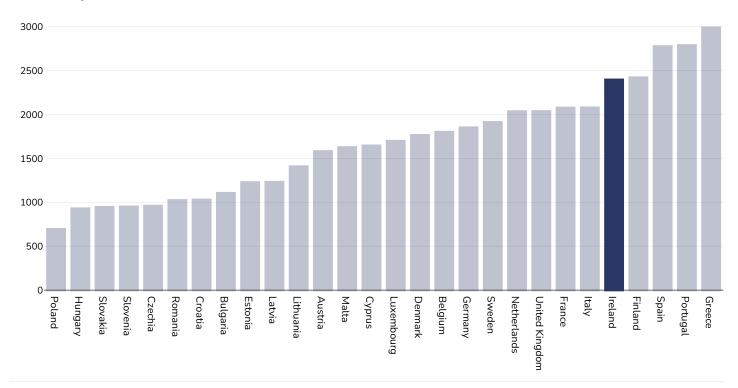
