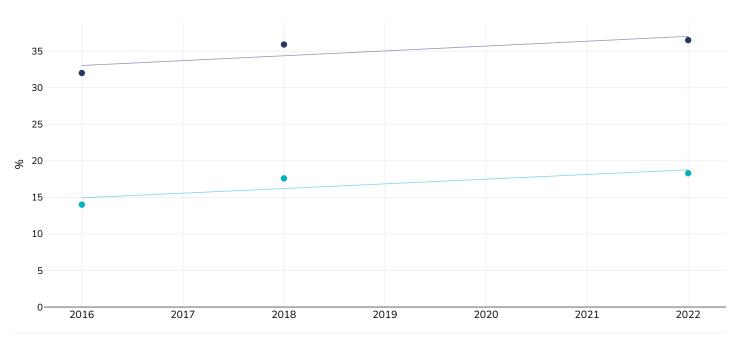

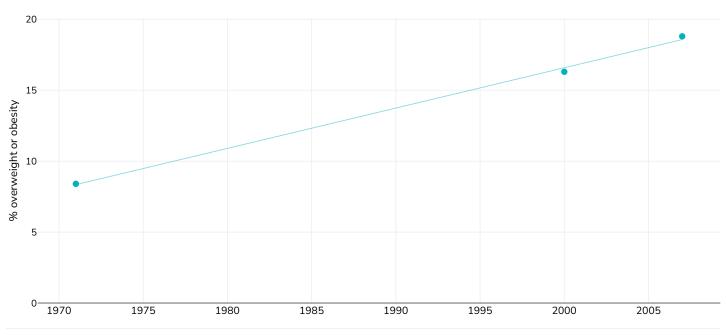

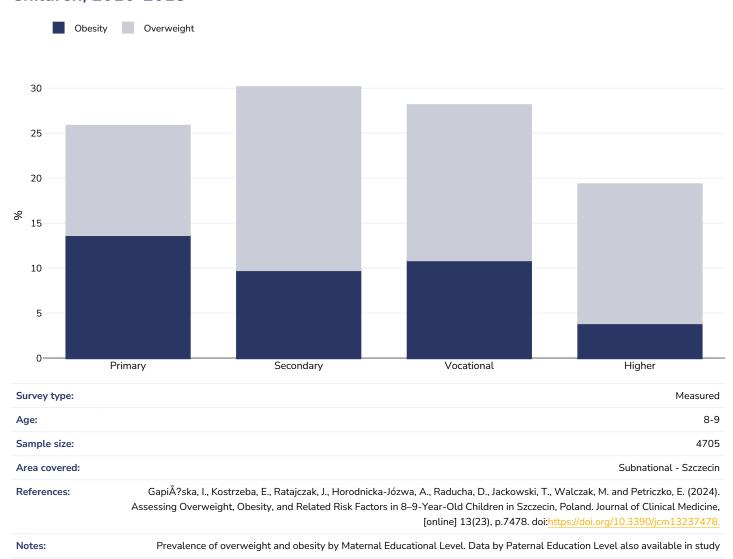

Children, 2016-2018

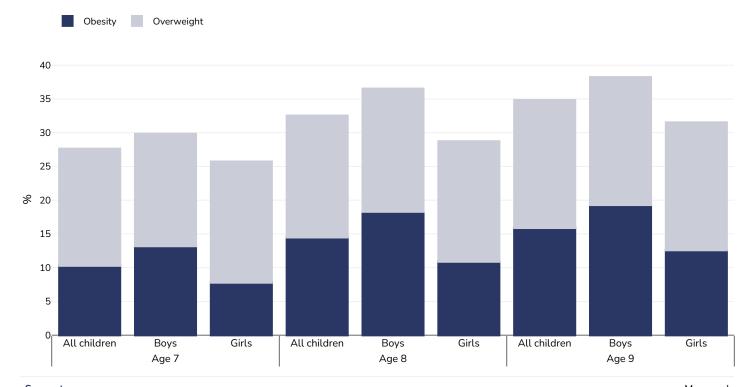

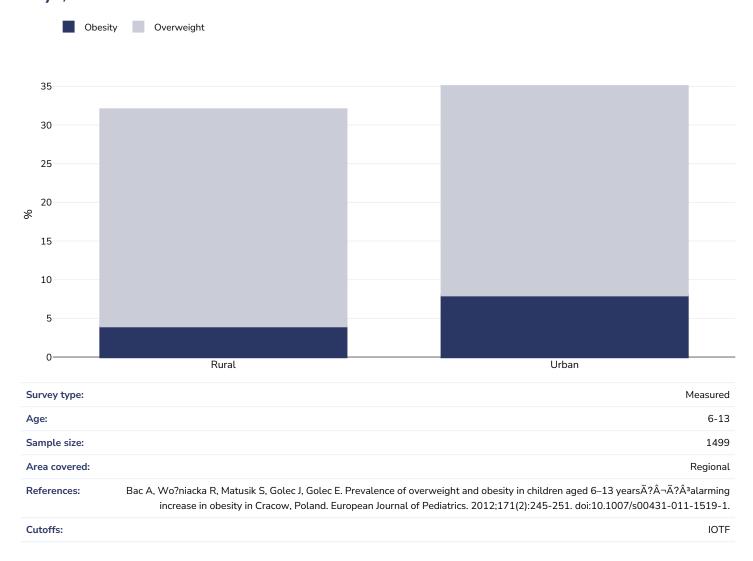

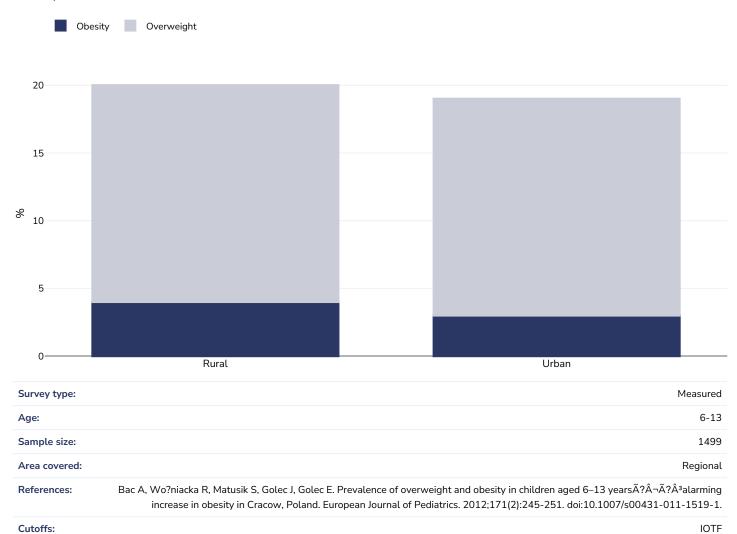
Overweight/obesity by region

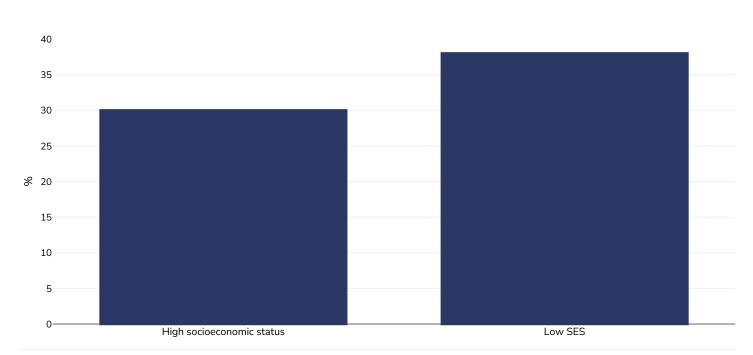




Overweight/obesity by socio-economic group

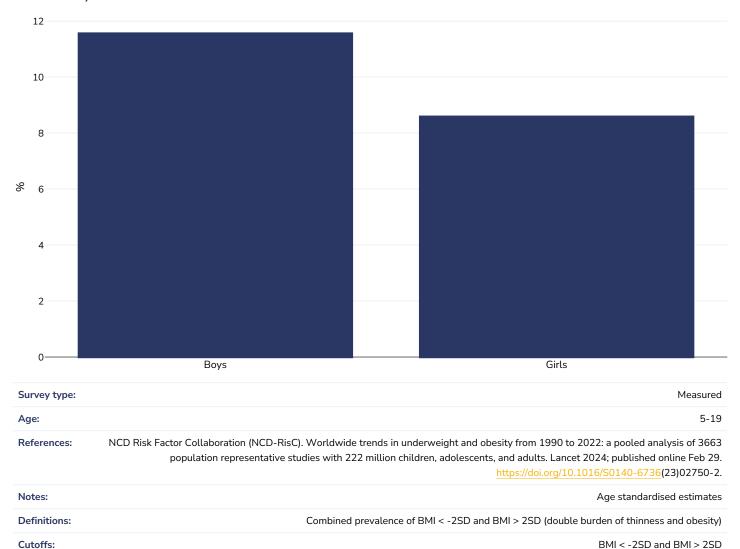

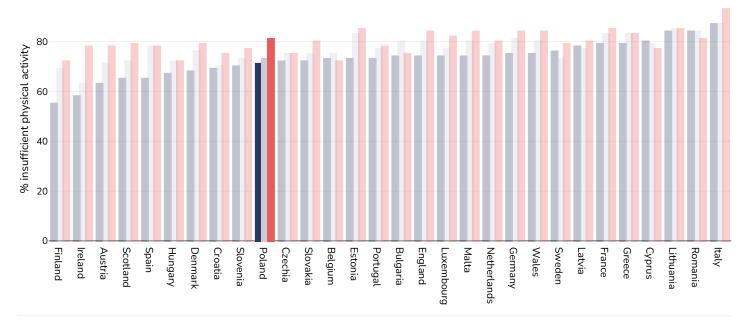

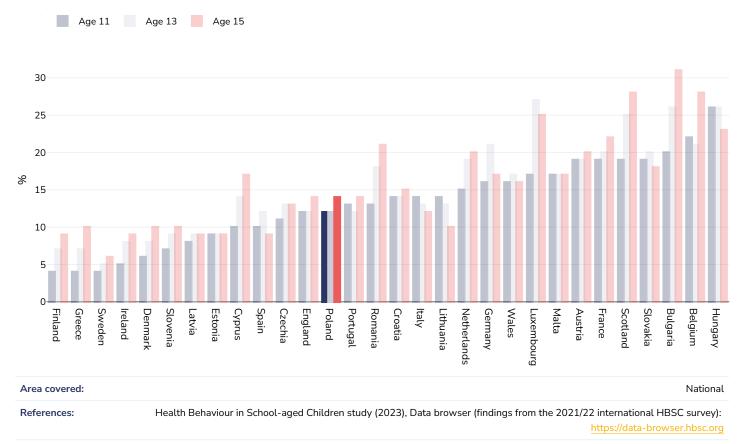

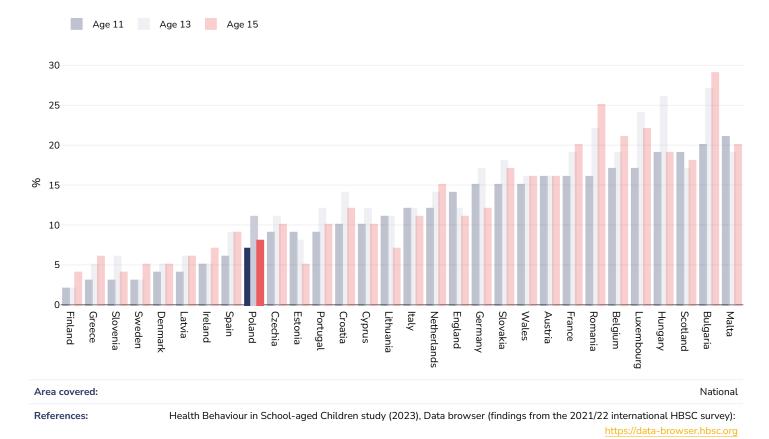
Proportion who reported drinking sugary soft drinks daily (at least once)

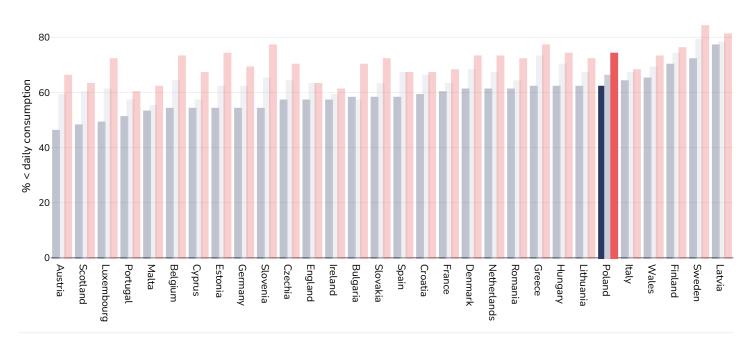




Prevalence of less than daily fruit consumption

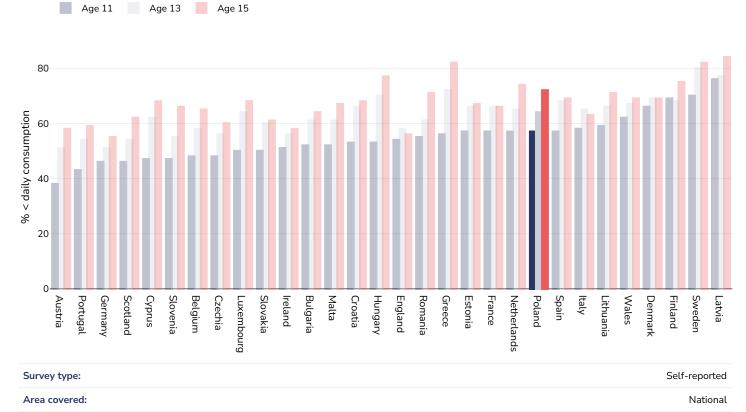

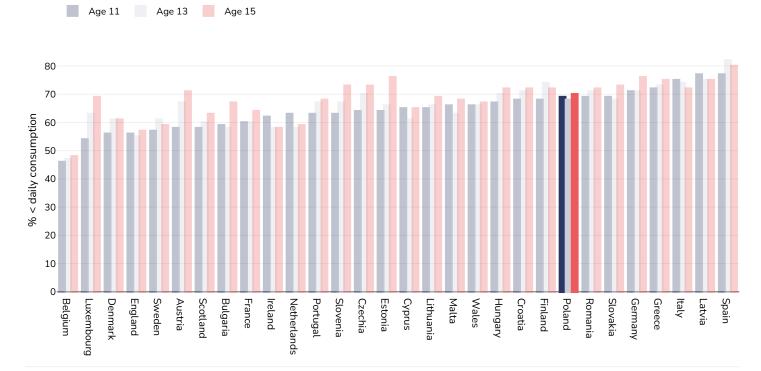

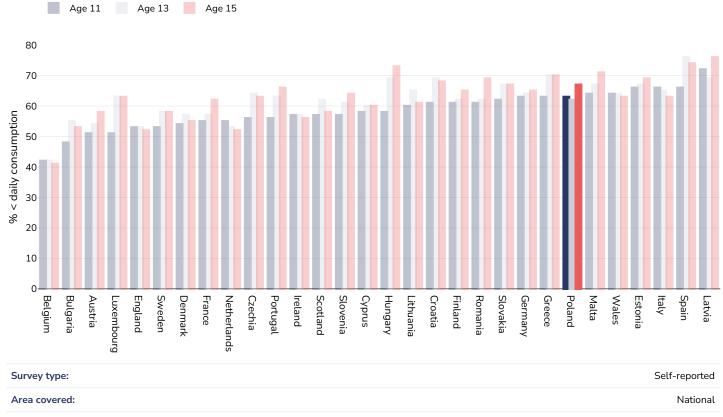

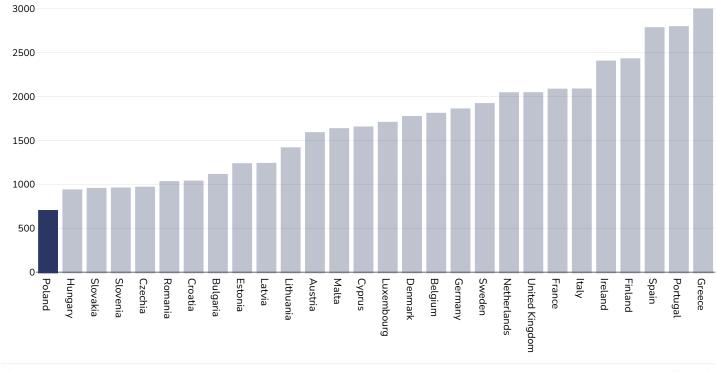
