## **Economic impact of overweight and obesity**

In 2019, the economic impact of overweight and obesity was estimated to be US\$72.93 million. This is equivalent to US\$6 per capita and 0.5% of GDP. Direct costs and indirect costs made up 20.7% and 79.3% of total costs respectively.

By 2060, economic impacts are predicted to increase to US\$951.17 million. This is equivalent to US\$31 per capita and 1.2% of GDP, and represents a 13.5-fold increase in total costs.
